Journey to Jesus

Where did you go on your last journey? It could have been to a place far away or a place close to home. Those journeys that take us far away from our homes require much planning and preparation, whereas the journeys that only take us away an hour or two can happen on a moments notice.

Even when our journey is simply to the grocery store, we often spend time preparing. We check our cupboards and refrigerator to see what we need and make a list. We may call a neighbor to see if they need anything or check to see what the Food Bank needs for its shelves. We take time to prepare for our journey.

And before we can leave, we must pack. I am a chronic over packer. When I am going on a long trip, I often have to repack my suitcase two or three times because what I think I need the first time simply won't fit. But even when simply running to the store, we pack. We gather our wallet, our keys and our cell phone before we head out the door. If we are going to the grocery store, we gather our coupons and our list before heading out the door.

And no journey can be complete without travel. We drive, fly, walk, or ride to our destination. Someone may pick us up, or we may take ourselves, but we must travel. And travel always has the potential for breakdowns. Something can go wrong. A tire can go flat, a construction zone can make us detour, an accident can stop us in our tracks, and something can slow us down or change our course. When those things happen, we must focus on our destination.'

There is a saying that goes something like this – life is not about the destination, but about the journey. And overall I think that is true. Life is about enjoying each day and the process of living, not just trying to achieve some goal that you believe will make you happy. But there are times when the destination is important.

Today we find ourselves surrounded by reminders of Christmas. Well before Thanksgiving Christmas music could be found on your radio. Decorations sprung up even before the Halloween candy had disappeared. And it is easy to get caught up in the festivities. But where is the journey taking you? Is the journey of Christmas taking you to the mall to find the perfect present or to a quiet manger where a newborn Jesus lays sleeping?

This year as we journey through Advent towards Christmas, may we remember that our journey is leading us to Jesus. As we make plans, visit friends, write our cards, and do our shopping may our destination always be clear – we are celebrating the birth of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ who has promised to return and claim us for himself. We celebrate Christ the King. Merry Christmas.
