Angels from the Realms of Glory

One of the joys of the Christmas season is the music. I love to listen to the music of the season though the week before Thanksgiving I turned off the radio as they were already playing Christmas music. There is so much beautiful music to celebrate the season of Christmas. We recently took the boys to see the latest Grinch movie. I was thrilled to hear God Rest Ye Merry Gentlemen in the background of the movie, proclaiming Christ's birth. It is wonderful to hear the story of our salvation from the radio, movies and of course worship as we journey through Advent.

One of the hymns that we often sing during the season is *Angels from the Realms of Glory*. This hymn was written by James Montgomery. His story has a tragic beginning. James' parents felt called in the 1700's to become missionaries in Barbados. They left James at the age of 6 in a Moravian settlement in Ireland and left for Barbados. James never saw his parents again, for the perished in Barbados.

James was left with nothing. He was sent to England to go to school. He did not do well in school and became an apprentice to a baker. He soon learned that baking was not his gift. His teenage years were filled with drifting and searching. He eventually settled in Sheffield, England.

Soon James learned that he loved writing. He worked for the local newspaper, eventually purchasing the paper. James was jailed on two separate occasions for his editorials which were unpopular with local officials. James left prison a local hero. He used his status to help promote his favorite causes. He supported foreign missionaries and the British Bible Society.

According to <u>Then Sings My Soul</u> by Robert Morgan, early on Christmas Eve, 1816, James, 45, opened his Bible to Luke 2, and was deeply impressed by verse13. Pondering the story of the heralding angels, he took his pen and started writing. By the end of the day, his new Christmas poem was being read in the pages of his newspaper. It was later set to music and was first sung on Christmas Day, 1821.

"Angels from the Realms of Glory"

by James Montgomery, 1771-1854

- 1. Angels from the realms of glory, Wing your flight o'er all the earth; Ye who sang creation's story, Now proclaim Messiah's birth: Come and worship, Come and worship; Worship Christ, the new-born King.
- 2. Shepherds in the fields abiding, Watching o'er your flocks by night, God with man is now residing, Yonder shines the Infant Light: Come and worship:
 Come and worship,
 Worship Christ, the new-born King.
- 3. Sages, leave your contemplations; Brighter visions beam afar; Seek the great Desire of nations, Ye have seen His natal star: Come and worship, Come and worship; Worship Christ, the new-born King.
- 4. Saints, before the altar bending, Watching long in hope and fear, Suddenly the Lord, descending, In His Temple shall appear: Come and worship, Come and worship; Worship Christ, the new-born King.

In our hymnal the third stanza above is replaced with:

Wise men, leave your contemplation, Brighter visions beam afar; Seek the great Desire of nations, Ye have seen His natal star: Come and worship, Come and worship; Worship Christ, the new-born King.

There is also another stanza:

All creation, join in praising, God the Father, Spirit, Son Evermore your voices raising, To the eternal Three in one Come and worship, Come and worship; Worship Christ, the new-born King.

James Montgomery was dealt a difficult hand in life. Yet, he did not become bitter to turn from God. His faith is evident in the words to *Angels from the Realms of Glory*. No matter what is happening in your life, I pray that the music of the season will fill your heart with the hope, peace, joy and love that comes from knowing Christ.
