American handbell choirs use bells made in England or by Malmark Bell craftsmen or by Schulmerich Bells based in Pennsylvania. Handbell choirs act as one instrument with each musician responsible for particular notes and so require music composed or arranged specifically for handbells. (Wikipedia.org)
