The Board has voted to require that all church volunteers get a Child Welfare and State Police Criminal Check. Although this is beyond what the law requires, we have decided to error on the side of caution. Any organization is permitted to add additional requirements beyond what the law requires.

If you are a volunteer, please see me or Linda, the church secretary, for a form which will be used to request your clearance. Once the clearance is obtained,

the form will be shredded and the clearances locked in the church safe.

If volunteers would rather get their own clearances, they can go to "The News Flash" page of the church website; and see an article that links to the sites where clearances can be requested directly.

Note that during the process of filling out the Child Welfare Clearance, you will be asked if you have a charge code. Answer "yes" and then e-mail me to request the code. You will need an email if you do the CWC clearance. If you do not have one, you can easily create a gmail.com account.




April Recap of Church Celebrations
