Blessed are...

Beginning on Sunday, October 2, 2016 we will begin a new sermon series on the Beatitudes. I admit that this series is already challenging me. This is the longest sermon from Jesus that we have recorded. Because this is Jesus' words, we need to take note and really listen to what he has to say. The challenge becomes in understanding the meaning behind them. I won't promise that I understand them completely, but I do promise to faithfully work at unpacking them for us. I am including the Beatitudes in several different translation and paraphrases for you to ponder. See you Sunday.

Matthew 5:1-12New International Version (NIV)

5 Now when Jesus saw the crowds, he went up on a mountainside and sat down. His disciples came to him, ² and he began to teach them.

He said:

- ³ "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ⁴ Blessed are those who mourn, for they will be comforted.
- ⁵ Blessed are the meek,

for they will inherit the earth.

- ⁶ Blessed are those who hunger and thirst for righteousness, for they will be filled.
- ⁷Blessed are the merciful, for they will be shown mercy.
- ⁸ Blessed are the pure in heart, for they will see God.
- ⁹ Blessed are the peacemakers, for they will be called children of God.
- ¹⁰ Blessed are those who are persecuted because of righteousness, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven.
- ¹¹ "Blessed are you when people insult you, persecute you and falsely say all kinds of evil against you because of me. ¹² Rejoice and be glad, because great is your reward in heaven, for in the same way they persecuted the prophets who were before you.

Matthew 5:1-12The Message (MSG)

5 ¹⁻² When Jesus saw his ministry drawing huge crowds, he climbed a hillside. Those who were apprenticed to him, the committed, climbed with him. Arriving at

a quiet place, he sat down and taught his climbing companions. This is what he said:

- ³ "You're blessed when you're at the end of your rope. With less of you there is more of God and his rule.
- ⁴ "You're blessed when you feel you've lost what is most dear to you. Only then can you be embraced by the One most dear to you.
- ⁵ "You're blessed when you're content with just who you are—no more, no less. That's the moment you find yourselves proud owners of everything that can't be bought.
- ⁶ "You're blessed when you've worked up a good appetite for God. He's food and drink in the best meal you'll ever eat.
- ⁷ "You're blessed when you care. At the moment of being 'care-full,' you find yourselves cared for.
- ⁸ "You're blessed when you get your inside world—your mind and heart—put right. Then you can see God in the outside world.
- ⁹ "You're blessed when you can show people how to cooperate instead of compete or fight. That's when you discover who you really are, and your place in God's family.
- ¹⁰ "You're blessed when your commitment to God provokes persecution. The persecution drives you even deeper into God's kingdom.
- ¹¹⁻¹² "Not only that—count yourselves blessed every time people put you down or throw you out or speak lies about you to discredit me. What it means is that the truth is too close for comfort and they are uncomfortable. You can be glad when that happens—give a cheer, even!—for though they don't like it, *I* do! And all heaven applauds. And know that you are in good company. My prophets and witnesses have always gotten into this kind of trouble.

Max Lucado catches the idea beautifully in his book on the Beatitudes called *The Applause of Heaven*.

God applauds the poor in spirit.
He cheers the mourners.
He favors the meek.
He smiles upon the hungry.
He honors the merciful.
He welcomes the pure in heart.
He claps for the peacemakers.
He rises to greet the persecuted.

- Pastor Brenda and Linda Cook will attend the ABCOPAD Biennial Conference from October 27 – 29 in Altoona



<u>UNICEF</u>

In 1950, a small group of kids in Philadelphia created Trick-or-Treat for UNICEF. They decorated milk cartons and collected \$17 on Halloween to help children left vulnerable by World War II.


