Things I Have Learned Along the Way...

17 years! I can't believe it has been 17 years that I have been your pastor. I still remember that first week vividly. I had no idea what I was doing. In fact, the first Monday I was in the office the prayer chain claimed that someone had died, who was really only ill. It was a memorable morning!

There have been many memorable moments since then. As I think about these past years, it is impossible not to think about the saints who have gone before us. There have been so many. It is impossible not to smile as I remember them for their love and faith that are interwoven in the fabric of this place and our lives.

Things have changed a bit over the last 17 years. I did not even have a cell phone when I started my ministry here. My mother insisted that if I was going to live alone that I get a cell phone. I thought it was frivolous and ridiculous, now I never leave home without it. Our sanctuary is not as full as it was all those years ago, but there are some things that remain the same.

We still put God first. We believe that loving God and others is the most important thing we can do with our lives. We continue to work in our community and share the love of Jesus with those we meet. I am glad to be a part of the Upland Baptist Church and its community.

I want to share a couple of things that I have learned over the past 17 years.

The best sermons aren't spoken.

We often use the quote: Preach the Gospel at all times. Use words if necessary. I have been reminded over the years that people rarely remember anything I say on a Sunday morning. What they remember are the times I sit with them at the hospital or walk beside them during grief or tragedy. It isn't always the words that matter, it is being present and faithful.

• Getting my hands dirty earns peoples' respect.

Over the years I have shoveled snow, washed dishes, waited tables, unloaded food deliveries, swept the walk and cleaned the bathroom floor to name a few of the things they never mentioned in Seminary. I try not to ask people to do things I am not willing to do myself. Working alongside others matters.

• No one is perfect; forgiveness matters.

You don't need to be a pastor to have this be significant in your life, but it has helped me to remember that I am not without sin. No one is perfect and I make mistakes. I have asked for forgiveness and received it from God and from people. Remembering to be forgiving and seek forgiveness really does change lives, mine included.

Sometimes the to-do list doesn't matter.

I will admit, I like to cross things off my life. It makes me feel like progress is being made. What I have learned though is being open to the unexpected makes me a better pastor and person. Often the opportunity to share the love of God is unscheduled.

The most important part of my day is listening.

Every week I begin on Monday morning by making a to-do list, but the important things that happen during the week rarely are on that list. What is important are the impromptu conversations, the opportunities to share with someone what is happening in their lives, simply listening. Listening is the best part of pastoring.

• I can go a hospital visit in jeans.

I used to rush home and change clothes before heading to the hospital when someone called on my day off or when I was doing something casual. Then I realized no one cares what I am wearing. So, Labor Day when I received a call that someone was in the hospital, I ran over wearing the same thing I had worn to the picnic. Loving others is about being present.

No one cares if I preach in pants.

I think they did. When I started preaching, I think there were several ladies who would have been offended if I had preached in a pair of pants. Times have changed; no one cares if I wear pants. It is the Word that matters, not what I look like while delivering it.

Pastoral visits sometimes happen by phone, and by text.

As the years have gone by I have realized that most of us are busy. Gone are the days when the pastor visited every house every year. Instead I try to keep in touch. Often that means a quick phone call or even a text. Of course, this is a two-way street and I need you all to let me in on what is happening in your lives. Keeping in touch is what really matters.

• Seminary really did not prepare me for pastoring.

When I think back to my classes in seminary, they weren't very practical. No one discussed the need for knowing how to restart the boiler or where they water meter is housed. No one talked about the challenges of upkeep on a building or the daily challenges to keep up with members who are all going in different directions. No one taught us how to balance an individual's needs with the needs of the church. There are so many things that seminary did not prepare me for. What it did teach me is that a strong foundation will see you through.

Though I have learned much these past 17 years, there is still much to learn. There is more to learn about who God is and what it means to follow him. There is more to learn about loving God and others. There is more to learn about being a witness in this world. There is more to learn about being a pastor and leading this congregation that God has entrusted me with. There is always more growing to do.

Thank you for walking with me in the past and for today. Thank you for the commitment to keep going towards the future. I don't know what tomorrow will bring, but I know that we are stronger, more faithful and better equipped when we go together.
