## Praying with the Pastor

**1 John 5:14** And this is the boldness we have in him, that if we ask anything according to his will, he hears us.

**Ephesians 6:18** ~ And pray in the Spirit on all occasions with all kinds of prayers and requests. With this in mind, be alert and always keep on praying for all the Lord's people.

Jeremiah 29:12 ~ Then you will call on me and come and pray to me, and I will listen to you.

**James 5:13** ~ Is anyone among you in trouble? Let them pray. Is anyone happy? Let them sing songs of praise.

Matthew 5:44 ~ But I tell you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you

**Matthew 26:41** ~ "Watch and pray so that you will not fall into temptation. The spirit is willing, but the flesh is weak."

**1 John 1:9** ~ If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness.

These are just a few of the scriptures calling us to pray. Over and over again in scripture we are instructed to pray, to pray when times are good, to pray when times are difficult, to pray with joy, to pray in sorrow, to pray for those we love, to pray for our enemies. We are called to pray.

When I am asked about what prayer is, I normally respond that prayer is a conversation between us and God. As with any conversation, there should be times of speaking and listening. Even though God knows the desires of our heart, he yearns for us to share them with him. God wants us to bring our hurts, our joys, our concerns, our questions to him. God wants to hear from us. He also wants us to listen to him. He wants us to be still and listen to his voice, to experience his presence, to be comfortable in his presence.

We are called to prayer. We are called to relationship with God. When we spend intentional time in prayer, our relationship with God grows and deepens. There is no one way to pray. Some pray on their knees, others pray as they walk, drive or shower. Others have a particular place they like to go to be close to God. The how is not as important as simply being intentional about being in God's presence and praying.

There are so many things we can pray about each day. We often begin with health concerns, those we know who have something physically wrong with them. That is not where

we want to stop. We also want to pray for our leaders both world leaders and local leaders, even the leaders of our church. We pray for those who are unhappy, filled with grief, struggling in a relationship. We pray for those who are homeless, hungry, abused, addicted and lost. We pray for our neighbors, our friends, our family and our enemies. There is so much we can pray for that sometimes if feels overwhelming.

Fortunately, God hears our hearts. He knows what we are concerned about, what we worry about and what we rejoice in. Still he wants to be in relationship with us. In order to do that, we must spend time with God, time in worship, time in study, time in prayer.

I often find it encouraging to pray with someone else. When we share the burdens of our hearts together and lift them to God, it reminds us that we are not alone. Praying together strengthens us.

So, I would like to invite you to join me in **Praying with the Pastor on Wednesdays at 9:30am.** We will meet in my office and spend 30 minutes in prayer together. This will be an informal time. So, come as you are as we enter God's presence and listen to his voice together.

I know that some of you can't make 9:30 am on a Wednesday morning. There will be slips of paper for prayer requests in the back of the sanctuary. You can give those to me on Sunday and we will pray with you, even though you aren't in the room. You can also email me (<u>brendaabshaw@gmail.com</u>) with requests.

A praying church is a growing church. When people pray, they are able to follow God more closely. We want to be people who are growing in our ability to *Love God! Love Others!* Please join me in prayer this fall, whether you can gather in my office or not. Let's join together in prayer.
