Devotional Thought...

Psalm 100:4-5 Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his courts with praise; give thanks to him and praise his name. For the LORD is good and his love endures forever; his faithfulness continues through all generations.

Philippians 4:6-7 Do not be anxious about anything, but in every situation, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, present your requests to God. And the peace of God, which transcends all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

Every Thanksgiving, students are asked to write, draw, or list things for which they are thankful. When we were having VBS Night, we asked the children to name something they are grateful or thankful for as part of our prayer before eating. We heard many answers. Sometimes they had to stop and think and other times, their answers were given immediately. They were thankful for food, shelter, their families, their toys, school, sports, etc. If I asked you what you were thankful for, how would you answer? Would you have to stop and think or would your answers just flow from your lips?

Thankfulness should be a way of life for us, naturally flowing from our hearts and mouth. When we are thankful, our focus moves from our wants and desires and even our painful circumstances. Expressing our thankfulness helps us remember that we belong to God, and that we have been blessed with having God in our lives and with us always. It is easy to give praise and thanks to God when everything is going well in our lives, but that is often the time when we forgot to do so. Everything is going smoothly, so who thinks they need to stop and thank God? And, we find it difficult to give praise and thanks to God when things are difficult and we do not think that God cares. But that is when we need to do it the most to remind ourselves that God is always with us. God will not let us go through our trials and tribulations we need to pray, with thanksgiving, thanking God for being with us and for never leaving our side. God does not promise to change every situation, but promises to give us peace and never leave us. In times of trials and tribulations, David, Job, and Paul still praised God for his faithfulness and love. We need to do the same.
