

Volunteer Clearances

All of our current volunteers now have Pennsylvania child welfare clearances.

If you would like to become a new volunteer in any of our programs for children, you can contact me and I'll be glad to help you obtain your required clearances. Remember that no one can work with youngsters unless their clearances are on file.

If you are involved with any of our ministries for children on a regular basis, the law states that you are required to take online training for <u>Mandatory Reporting</u>. In order to register for the course, click on *Registration* and complete all the fields. If you are a volunteer, the "County of employment" should be N/A. If you are a volunteer, the answer to the question in the last field: "are you currently Licensed..." is *NO*.

This training is helpful and informative and can benefit each of us as Christians concerned for the welfare of kids.
